**July 28<sup>th</sup> Soap Suds and Dirty Duds**

Try washing laundry by hand with only a washboard and metal basin filled with water heated over the fire in our set kettle. Hang the clean laundry out to dry and make your own scented soaps to use at home. Ages 5-8. Meet at the Remick Barn.



**August 18<sup>th</sup> Puddin 'n Pie**

Discover what people ate in the 18<sup>th</sup> century! Bake pie in the dutch oven and make pudding over the fire. While the food cooks work on a colonial craft to take home. Ages 5-8. Meet at the Remick Barn.



**July 30<sup>th</sup> Painting History**



So you love art? Well join us as we head outside with palettes, paint, and paper. Use the Old York buildings and grounds as inspiration, to create your own rendition of history. Ages 8-12. Meet at the Remick Barn.
